- be active hands on learners in a social setting that recognizes the importance of peer tutoring, role modelling, discussion and learning together.
- be supported to develop a positive self image, responsibility, independence and self regulation.

Educators will:

- establish a child friendly environment that respects children's rights, their diversity and ensures equity.
- form collaborative partnerships to nurture children's, wellbeing, safety and learning.
- passionately promote the value of play as a tool for learning and growth.
- collaborate widely to provide a comprehensive school transition process for each child and family.
- be invested, reflective, and committed to continuous improvement.
- be committed to their ongoing professional learning and the preschool as a learning community.
- promote respect for self, others, materials and the environment.

Our Environment will;

- be a stimulating, active contributor to learning that sparks the imagination, thinking, questioning and experimenting.
- have a natural rhythm, and a relaxed pace with a balance of self selected, spontaneous activities and intentional teaching.
- encourage children to explore and enrich their creativity by providing a wide range of open ended experiences, materials and resources.

Our Preschool will:

- foster a culture of sustainability that helps children see themselves as citizens and stewards of the earth.
- support the education of Early Childhood professionals and research into learning.
- foster links with schools and other agencies and advocate for children, education and families.
- have high ethical standards, abide by relevant laws and maintain a commitment to continuous improvement.


